Lāna'i Community Hospital is now offering antigen/rapid COVID-19 testing EVERY Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 8.30 am - 3 pm.

- Call the hospital at (808) 565-8450 (Arlene or Charita) to pre-register
- Billing is done through your insurance company, so contact your medical insurance agency to see how you are covered
- If you are uninsured, ask the hospital about available options

PROTECT OUR REFUSE COLLECTORS

Please use best practices in taking out your trash to protect our island's refuse collectors.

- Bag all trash
- Tie bags well
- Double bag your trash, if possible
- Get out as much air from the bag as possible, so that it doesn't take up space in the trash bin and helps prevent overflow that collectors may have to touch
- Don't overfill the trash cart/bin
- Don't leave bags next to trash cart/bin; it might not be picked up

WHO SHOULD GET TESTED FOR COVID-19?

1. Anyone who has not yet been tested.
2. Children and senior citizens; not enough Lānaʻi keiki and kupuna are being tested.
3. Vulnerable individuals with underlying health conditions that may cause additional problems if you become infected with COVID-19.
4. Everyone in families, particularly if there are seniors in the family. Anyone in the family may infect others. To keep multigenerational families safe, all members should be tested.
5. If you've been tested before, but had contact with others after being tested, especially if you live with someone who is positive or are a close contact of a positive case.
6. Everyone who was tested last Saturday, in case the level of virus in your body was too little to be detected at the time.
